## Recycling Improvements

What's hundreds of miles wide and consists of hundreds of thousands of bits of man-made debris? The North Atlantic Garbage Patch is mostly plastic waste that's found its way to the ocean via our rivers and seas. And if it goes into landfill instead, plastic takes a long, long time to decompose (if at all).

So it's great news that from 1 May we can recycle a lot more plastic. It was limited to plastic bottles now we can take a much wider range to the recycling centres – anything labelled 1, 2, 4 or 5 in the triangular 'PET' symbol (*right*) that you can find on most packaging (usually on the bottom of the container).



This includes things like soft drinks bottles, yoghurt pots, soap dispenser bottles, margarine tubs, and most of those clear plastic containers that supermarkets and shops use to package food such as strawberries. Even things like carrier bags, six-pack rings, plastic cups, buckets and laundry baskets are recyclable, as they are mostly PET 4 or 5!

I've been separating such items for the past month, and it's amazing how much of a difference it makes to what goes in the black bin.

(PET 3 – in case you're wondering why it's missing from the list – is PVC, such as window frames, and although they can be recycled, it has to be done by a specialist, so don't take PVC to the recycling bank yet.)

## Local Rarities

We're incredibly lucky in this small part of Kent that we can see (and hear) three bird species that are disappearing very fast worldwide, so watch out for cuckoos, nightingales and turtle doves (*right*) returning from Africa. They can be heard now right here in Golden Green, but who knows for how much longer?

## 208 Bus Service – Timetable Changes

The 208 service is now run by a company called Autocar with financial help from KCC. (Tel 01892 833830.) Ask a driver for a timetable.

Please note the service times have changed: the mornings are straightforward – 40 minutes past the hour going to Tonbridge, and 55 minutes past the hour at the station coming back. However, after 1.40pm, the times are more sporadic: from Golden Green at 3.01pm, 3.40pm, 4.53pm, 5.48pm, 6.48pm. Return from Tonbridge station: 3.35 (school days only), 4.12pm, 5.05pm, 6.05pm, 7.05pm. On Saturdays from Golden Green at 13 minutes past the hour, return from the station at 30 minutes past the hour. No buses on Sundays or bank holidays so you'll have to stay at home!
