Fast Fibre Update

Several people have asked me recently what's happening on the broadband front so here's an update.

Re BT, the new cabinet next to the bus shelter outside the Mission Hall is not connected and there's lots more work to be done including upgrading Hadlow Exchange. An OpenReach engineer I spoke to recently confirmed that superfast from BT isn't likely to be available until the end of the year. When it is, remember the service goes the rest of the way to your house by slower copper wire.

Effort to register enough subscribers for Gigaclear continue. The subscriber target counter at gigaclear.com has been split into three areas: north Hadlow is at 80% of their target so, lucky people, their first cabinet will go in very shortly. South Hadlow & GG is at 53% so if people continue to register, we could be next. East Hadlow is at 13%. This correlates with how the sales team have been deployed, and is roughly in line with the cable laying as they head south from Shipbourne. Gigaclear hope to hold some events in GG soon, so you can learn more about it then, or contact their head rep at Rob.Seymour@gigaclear.com.

Just a reminder that Gigaclear are completely independent of BT/OpenReach, and their cable will be fibreoptic all the way to your modem, giving a superior service, which they also hope will be live by the end of the year.

## GG Women's Institute Report by Iris Wilson

There was a buzz of anticipation at our Wednesday meeting as we prepared to listen to 'Auctioneers Tales' as told by Derek Hodge. He started by saying that he had been in auctioneering for many years with Ibbett Mosely and had seen many changes. He showed us the ivory gavel he uses, and brought to our attention the dark stain at the end of it, caused by him holding the gavel incorrectly; he said that he had been told about this many times.
