The Parish Council has to inform residents of a spate of anti-social behaviour and criminal damage at Williams Field. As a result of this sadly Lighthouse Youth Group has been forced to close. On a brighter note however we are pleased to announce that the Boxing Club has restarted on Monday evenings at 5.30pm (please enquire at parish office for term dates).

Recent damage reported to the police includes: destruction of cctv cameras, picnic benches, and doors at Hy-Arts Centre, Dismantling of fence sections at play area and gate, removal of new installed patio slabs and brickwork. We therefore ask the community to assist us in tackling these issues by reporting any damage to property at Williams Field to the Parish Council on 01732 851878 and contacting the police on 101 to report anti-social/vandalism if witnessed. We encourage everyone in the community to help reduce these problems to a minimum and remind everyone the costs involved in having to replace and repair.
