# GG Women's Institute by Iris Wilson

What an exciting history the *Medway Queen* has had, as related to us by Mark and Pam Bathurst. Also known as the 'Heroine of Dunkirk', she was built in Troon, Scotland in 1924 for service as a paddle steamer on the Medway and in the Thames Estuary.

In her early days she steamed routes from Strood and Chatham to Sheerness, Herne Bay and Margate, and in 1937 she was converted to oil-fired steaming. At the beginning of the war she was requisitioned by the Royal Navy as a minesweeper protecting the English Channel. In May 1940, Operation Dynamo was launched to rescue British soldiers stranded at Dunkirk. The Medway Queen became part of the flotilla of 'little ships' and was fitted with a 12-pounder gun and two machine guns. On her first return journey to Dover, which coincided with an air raid, she shot down a German aircraft outside the harbour.

She also rescued all the passengers and crew from the Brighton Belle, which had begun to sink after running over sunken wreckage but the Queen managed (heavily overloaded) to get them to safety. On her second trip she went right in close, taking soldiers directly off the beach as it was much quicker than waiting for the rowing boats to bring them out. Later on still she took men off from a concrete jetty or mole. On 3 June Vice Admiral Ramsey gave the order that all ships were to leave Dunkirk at 2.30am the following morning. By that time the *Medway* Queen had done seven trips across the channel, her final one to bring 400 French soldiers back to Dover. She gained four awards for gallantry, having shot down three enemy aircraft and rescued 7000 men.

In 1942 she was converted to a mine sweeping training ship until the end of the war. She was due to be scrapped in 1963; however, the Belgium shipbreaker refused to put her to scrap after finding out her history. She next

became a nightclub and marina clubhouse on the Isle of Wight. Eventually she fell into disrepair and in the early 1970s, sprang a leak and sank. In 1978 she was bought privately with a view to saving her. After several more years and sinking *again*, the Medway Queen Preservation Society was formed and, with the help of the National Lottery, in 2013 she was rededicated and restoration is still going on today at Gillingham Pier and 'she's looking good'!

On 17 July we shall be celebrating our 32nd birthday. The evening is by invitation only, with Melanie Gibson-Barton giving us the history of Teddies and other Bears.
