Tudeley/Capel New Town Tonbridge & Malling (TMBC) Planning & Transportation Meeting Wednesday 2 October 7.30pm TMBC Council Offices, Gibson Drive, Kings Hill

Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council will be discussing their recommendations to cabinet this Wednesday evening regarding the Tunbridge Wells Draft Local Plan, which contains proposals to develop 4000 new homes in Tudeley and Capel as well as a further 4000 houses in Paddock Wood. If these proposals are approved it will lead to the loss of over 1000 acres of picturesque Green Belt countryside that we all enjoy in Golden Green. GG Women's Institute by Iris Wilson

Local people will know of Ightham Mote, the lovely medieval manor house in the Kentish Weald right on our doorstep. Parts of the building date from 1330 and, although it started life as a modest 'great hall' plus several other domestic buildings, it has been added to over the centuries. 'Mote' could refer to the moat that surrounds it, said Pat Mortlock, who was welcomed back to tell us about its history.

The manor has changed hands several times in its long life, the first owner being Isolde Inge (1330-1360). Sir Thomas Cawne, the next owner, was responsible for the layout seen today; he died in 1374 and is buried in the parish church at Ightham, as are many of the previous owners, some of whom have very grand tombs. The last owner, American Charles Henry Robinson left the property to the National Trust when he died in 1985.

The Trust realised a massive conservation project was needed. They were meticulous about the work to be done to preserve the building. The conservation took 15 years and cost £10 million, 40% of which was grant-aided funding from English Heritage and the rest from public appeal. It was completed in 2004. Pat mentioned that during the conservation, a staircase was revealed and beneath one of the treads a pair of shoes was found (rather worse for wear after nearly 700 years!), the superstition being that by hiding the shoes, one warded off evil spirits.

With several outings in the pipeline we are having a busy time and at our next meeting on Wed 16 October, we anticipate a very interesting talk about the Crown Jewels by former Crown Jeweller David V Thomas.

All are welcome, the visitors' charge being £4, which includes refreshments. The Mission Hall doors open at 7.30pm for a 7.45pm start.
