Hadlow Speed Watch Team – Speed watch is planning to restart in the coming weeks. Now is a great opportunity to sign up as a volunteer and help monitor the speeds through our Parish. Speeding information is logged and sent to the police who send out warning letters and if a driver continues to be caught speeding after receiving three letters then a fine can be applied. The data collected by the police is also used as a gauge when consulting with the KCC Highways on road speed reduction programmes. The Speed Watch programme is a friendly and valuable asset to our community so please consider joining.
